Review/Approval of minutes from the August meeting: motion to approve minutes by Wendie Nielson. Seconded by Becky Parkin.

The school will try to do a better job of helping new parents not only receive information but explain what it is.

<u>Plans for the Year</u>: Land Trust – Minor adjustments in spending were made based on the October 1<sub>st</sub> enrollment but nothing that changed our plans for the school year.

Safety Concerns: There are still concerns about parking and traffic:

- Would like to have further discussion about parking procedure in faculty/bus lot
- Consider parking gate in faculty lot
- Ask for support from resource officer to help traffic flow
